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Tin Man Games' first Warhammer 40,000 digital gamebook app from the *Legacy of Dorn* series, ***Herald of Oblivion***, arrives on the iOS App Store, Google Play and the Amazon App Store today.

Tin Man Games, purveyors of digital gamebooks and interactive fiction, have partnered with Games Workshop to create a vast choice-based adventure novel, written by gamebook veteran Jonathan Green. Players can access the interactive fiction through their smart phones and tablets, turning them into Imperial Cogitators complete with a holographic combat simulator which brings the player face-to-face with the xenos scourge.

You are a veteran Space Marine of the Imperial Fists Chapter. Equipped with powerful Terminator armour and armed with the deadliest weapons that the Adeptus Astartes wield, you are a symbol of the Emperor's might. Trapped aboard the space hulk Herald of Oblivion and the only survivor of your squad, you must fight your way through the aliens and heretics that infest the star vessel and find a way to escape the horror and return to your Chapter.

Legacy of Dorn: Herald of Oblivion is available to download from the iOS App Store, Google Play and Amazon Appstore for Android. It costs \$5.99 USD/£4.49/5,99 €. It will also be available for PC, Mac and Linux on Steam and the Humble Store later in November. Two sequels, *Pits of Commorragh* and *Forge of War*, are planned for release in 2016.
